

Introduction:

Manas National Park, located in the northeastern part of India in the state of Assam, is one of the most renowned protected areas in the world, known for its rich biodiversity and being a UNESCO World Heritage Site. The park lies at the foothills of the Eastern Himalayas and covers an area of approximately 1,000 square kilometers, including both grasslands and tropical forests. This

educational tour was organized to expose students to the significance of wildlife

conservation, understand the unique ecosystem of the park, and explore the variety of flora and fauna it supports.

## **Objectives:**


